New Business

- Data Sharing
 - Kelly presented several data sets that are important for the direction of the coalition.
 - CCYS:
 - Lafayette is higher in binge drinking than the state
 - Lafayette is higher in marijuana usage than the state
 - Table 3: Drug Use Profile is high for marijuana usage amongst grade school students.
 - Table 4: Percentage of Students who used other illicit drugs: Methamphetamines is used sometimes by grade school students.
 - Table 5: Severe Substance Uses Indicators depicts the significance in those students who need alcohol treatment and those who ride with a drinking driver.
 - Table 6: Percentage of those Students with Antisocial Behavior indicates that seniors who are come to school drunk and high has decreased since 2008 by 15%.
 - Table 8: Students Reporting Risk is high in the following:
 - Parents attitude towards anti-social behavior

- Sustainability
 - Media
 - Lamar Billboard Company has provided the coalition with a year's worth of free advertising. They are rotating the existing billboards to different areas in Lafayette and around Lafayette.
 - Lafayette Police Department Awards
 - This will be provided by Tommy Faulk and Lafayette First Assembly
 - The ATAC officers will continue to be awarded for their great efforts!
 - Court Data
 - Research the court information in regards to where monies are being allocated for prevention.
 - Discuss working a line-item in for the coalition and our prevention efforts.
- Action Plan
 - Stay on Track will continue on with the National Guard.
 - The court monitor position will most likely be picked-up by MADD. Funding has been provided to MADD for court monitoring throughout the state of Louisiana. Lafayette has been chosen to receive a court monitor through MADD.
 - Compliance Checks will be funded once a month through the Lafayette Police.
 - ATAC will continue at the supervision of Dwayne Stutes. They anticipate hiring an additional officer come January.
- Miscellaneous

 - On October 20, 2011 from 10am to 3on PEARS will host a SWAP meet.
 - 70 agencies have confirmed to attend the SWAP meet. AOC has agreed to attend and film free commercials for local agencies.

 - Nick informed the coalition of a new ACT that was taking place to privatize the DMV, licenses and pass ports.
 - All drivers education classes will be privatized. Now instead of taking drivers education through the school private companies will be facilitating these classes. The Department of Public Safety will have oversight of these companies.
