Debris Drop is an opportunity for constituents of Lafayette Consolidated Government to drop off tires and other unwanted waste at five parks in Lafayette Parish to make the parish safer and cleaner. All five parks will operate from 7:30 a.m. until noon. The items that can be dropped off – and those items not accepted – are listed below.

Clean Up to Make Lafayette Cleaner & Safer!

YES (these items will be accepted)

- Tires (limit of 5)
- Wood
- Metal
- Construction Debris
- Bags & Boxes of Old Clothes and Other Waste
- Bicycles
- Buckets, Containers, Trash Cans
- Curtain Rods & Assemblies
- Small Appliances
- Car Parts
- Broken Items such as Flower Pots, etc.
- Any Broken, Unwanted Item
- Excluding Items on the “NO” List

NO (these items cannot be accepted)

- Furniture
- Large Appliances
- Chemicals
- Automotive Batteries
- Compressed Gas Cylinders
- Medical Waste
- Ammunition
- Explosives
- Any power equipment with a gasoline engine.

PARKS TO DROP OFF DEBRIS (ALL ARE OPEN 7:30 A.M. UNTIL NOON)

Neyland Park – off of Eraste Landry Rd.

Moore Park – off of N. University Ave.

Plantation Park – off of E. Kaliste Saloom Rd. (enter next to Plantation Elementary)

Beaver Park – off of Surrey St. (enter on Fisher Rd.)

Brown Park – off of E. Pont des Mouton Rd.

Please do your part to make Lafayette cleaner and safer by cleaning your property, which eliminates breeding grounds for mosquitoes, and dropping the debris at one of the parks listed above.
