PROPOSED FOR HISTORIC OVERLAY DISTRICTS

STERLING GROVE:

Sterling Grove National Register District was designated and added to the National Historic Register by the National Park Service on July 25, 1984. Sterling Grove has a distinguished grouping of 50+ year old buildings. The older residences, built before 1910, are Victorian and Edwardian buildings and one Greek Revival plantation house. Post-1910 buildings include a Romanesque Revival church, a Mission style house, a pedimented Colonial Revival house, American Craftsman houses, and an American Foursquare house.
